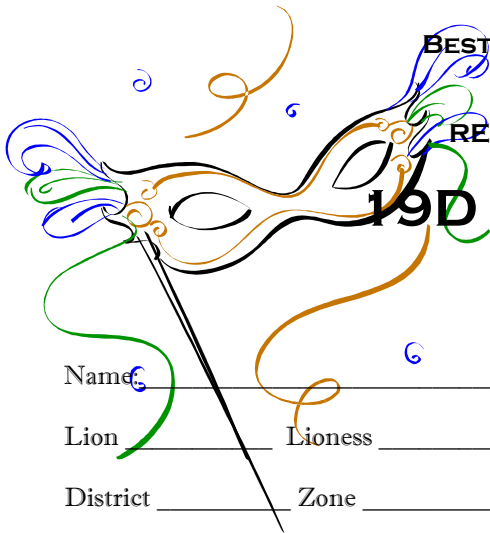
### Diabetes North Lion Rondeau Brown PZC
